Dear Members and Friends of First Congregational United Church of Christ,

It's hard to believe that this will be my last newsletter article to you as your interim pastor. Actually, it's hard to believe that I had to write so many of them! I have continued in this role longer than I imagined would be necessary when I began almost exactly a year ago. Then, I thought, "Surely there will be a new pastor by Christmas!" And then it was, "Surely by Easter," then, "Surely by Pentecost." (This is how pastors think — not by months, but by seasons of the church year.) But, as it turned out, I was privileged to be your pastor for all the seasons of a church year, and I really mean the "privileged" part.

It took longer than they wanted it to, but I want to commend the thoughtful and conscientious way the Pastoral Search Committee went through the process of identifying the person who has been called to be your/our new pastor. They worked very hard — meeting at 6:00 a.m. through a winter that most of us would like to forget. And they did good work. I trust that Pastor Jane will have a faithful and satisfying ministry among you. To her credit, she chose to come despite making her first visit shortly after those huge snowstorms of February. As Pat and I drove her and Dave around town, trying to peer past those huge mounds of snow, we kept trying to reassure her that this was not a usual winter — and I hope it won't be the new normal — but she was undeterred. She even said that she likes winter! If so, she has come to the right place.

I'll be talking with you about this from the pulpit at some point, but it's good to put into writing that I will need to be at some distance from this congregation while Pastor Jane is establishing herself as your pastor. It is our understanding in the United Church of Christ that a retiring pastor should stay away from the church he or she has served for at least a year. The policy regarding an interim is a little less clear, but Jane and I will work things out between us as to how long I should stay away before resuming active membership in our church. But I wanted to be sure that you understand why I won't be attending church for awhile after June 30, when Pastor Jane has her first Sunday with you as your pastor.

Besides being grateful to your very able and committed Church Council and President, I want to single out two people for special thanks for their help to me. First and foremost, Nan Pophal. Nan loves this church and its people, and she has trained a whole series of pastors, including yours truly. And then, one of those trainees, Pastor Jeff Wartgow, who reappeared in our midst in February to serve our congregation. I know that Jeff enjoyed his reunion with you, and that you appreciated his leadership in the depths of a difficult winter. There is a lot of love in this church, love that is personified in its leaders and its servants.

Ever since Pat and I moved to Eagle River some 16 years ago, we have appreciated this congregation, and we are both grateful for the opportunity we have had to be members of this congregation and to provide pastoral leadership here. As I wrote in my letter of recommendation provided as part of the church profile to prospective pastoral candidates, the person who serves as a pastor of this church will be a fortunate person indeed. Thank you for the many kindnesses you have extended to me during my interim pastorate. Thank you for your continued friendship.

JUNE BRINGS CHANGES TO FIRST UCC

Spring is bringing changes — not only to the beautiful Northwoods in which we live, but also in our church. It's an exciting time!

As most of you know, **Pastor Jane Courtright will share her first Sunday with us as our settled pastor on June 30th.** We will be adding a new staffer to the church office and modifying our office hours.

Kathy Holperin joins Nan Pophal in the church office beginning May 28th. Kathy will be working 15 hours a week and will focus her efforts on all things related to technology. This includes ensuring our church web site is updated, installing software updates, making sure we are getting the most out of our current software/technology in terms of maximizing both efficiency and cost-savings, preparing PowerPoints for Sunday service, researching upgrades for our audio/visual equipment in the sanctuary and a long list of other tasks.

Nan will be working approximately 27 hours a week and continue to serve as office manager supporting the pastor and congregation much as she does now while working with Kathy to incorporate technology into her daily work.

The Church Council approved these changes at its May meeting. They were outlined in a proposal developed by Donna DePape, chair of the Pastor Parish Committee in concert with Nan and Kathy. Some members of the Council, concerned about the need to move our church forward technologically, initiated the conversation and Donna worked with Nan and Kathy to develop a plan that was agreeable to both. Pastor Dale also was involved in the conversations.

As part of the changes, Council also agreed with the team's recommendation to eliminate times when Nan or other staff are alone in the building while it is open to the public — primarily for safety reasons. So, **beginning June 3, the church office will be open from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, and closed on Friday.** These hours are similar to those observed by other churches in our area.

Since Kathy is becoming a member of the church staff, she has resigned her position as Vice President of the Church Council. (Note: Although Nan and Kathy were involved in developing the new staffing plan, to avoid potential concerns regarding a conflict of interest, Kathy did not take part in the Council's deliberations when the plan was adopted.) The congregation will be asked to elect a new vice president to fill the remaining year of her term during our September Annual Meeting. Until then, the Council will operate with six members.

I extend a huge thank you to several people, first and foremost, Kathy and Nan for their willingness to partake in this new arrangement. I believe embracing and using technology more efficiently will ultimately help this church succeed and thrive as we embrace our mission and "open our doors and hearts to all in service and love, as modeled by Jesus Christ."

A big thank you to Donna DePape for working with Nan and Kathy and developing a workable plan agreeable to all, and to Paula Hendrickson for her help with the financial aspects of this plan. Both Donna and Paula worked to ensure the changes were made without going over the church's current budget. And, a huge thank you, also to Pastor Dale, not only for his assistance through this process, but also for his support, leadership, spiritual guidance, sense of humor, and so much more this past year. Dale, you made a very challenging year a little easier and a lot more fun. You will be missed!

The best gift for Father's Day

Father's Day loom along with a national agonizing, "What are we going to get Dad this year?" The advertising industry tells us that men want ties, cologne, and liquor. Don't believe it!

Maybe the best gift we can offer a father is the risk of embarrassing him and ourselves by sharing what he means to us. This means no purchased message, no expensive card. A simple sheet of paper will do.

A mother of several grown children remarked, "Just once, I wish our children would write to their dad and say, 'Thanks for working so hard for me.'"

Wrap that gift, if you like, but your words will be treasured long after the gift is forgotten.

A child's letter to God:

"Dear God, I want to be just like my Daddy when I get big, but with hair on my head."

What is a vacation?

A vacation is a succession of 2's. It consists of 2 weeks, which may be 2 short. Afterwards you are 2 tired 2 return 2 work, but 2 broke not 2. Therefore, be sure 2 bring or mail 2 the church your 2 weeks offering before you leave. If you don't we will be 2 far behind 2 do all the things for the Lord that he wants us 2 do.

Nutrition and healthy eating

Most of us have gotten the message. Upping our quota of fruits and veggies, and lowering our intake of salt, sugar, processed foods and red meat is a good idea. But if you're struggling to master the art of cooking for wellness, you're definitely not alone. Nutrition pros have developed many techniques and tricks that can help modify recipes for healthier eating — and evidence based research tells us they taste great, too.



Nutrition experts often recommend starting with some new-to-you recipes to launch your healthier eating journey. Soon you'll be able to transform favorite recipes into healthier versions, too. Remember: "healthier" doesn't mean "less tasty." Keep your mind open to experiencing new flavors. Enjoy the process as you experiment with fresh ingredients and create dishes that don't rely on fat and salt for taste.

Most of us consume too much saturated fat. But fat adds flavor, so scaling back fat alone is not the answer. Studies have found, though, if you scale back fat and pump up flavor by adding herbs and spices, you can get the great taste you crave. For instance, instead of 80 percent lean meat, choose 95 percent lean meat. Then, use a heavier hand with the basil, oregano, garlic and other favorite flavors for a really satisfying result.

Researchers have tried the approach with dessert, too. In one study, they cut the sugar content of apple crisp by more than a third, but added an extra jolt of cinnamon to compensate. It worked: tasters like that version just as much as the full-sugar original. Build up your store of herbs and spices, set the salt aside and you've got a solid formula for healthier, tastier eating.

Learn some basic ingredient swaps and you'll instantly up your healthy cooking quotient. Examples:

- ◆ Heavy cream or half-and-half = fat-free half-and-half
- ◆ 1 egg = 2 egg whites
- ◆ Garlic salt = garlic powder
- ◆ Syrup = pureed fruit
- ◆ Ground beef = extra-lean beef, or ground chicken or ground turkey
- ◆ White rice = wild rice, pearl barley or bulgur wheat
- ◆ Beware the fryer! Eating a lot of fried food has been associated with a higher risk of type 2 diabetes, obesity and heart disease. Instead, learn to bake, grill, steam and roast.
- ◆ Pre-heat your saute pan. Adding cold ingredients to a cold pan results in drier, less tasty food; starting with a hot pan lets you sear in flavor.
- ◆ Nonstick pan. Does your recipe call for sautéing vegetables in oil? Using a good nonstick pan, you can usually saute without added fat.
- ◆ Steamer basket. Many top chefs steam fish, chicken or seafood atop a layer of aromatic herbs or vegetables for moist, flavorful results without adding fat.
- ◆ Kitchen shears. Invaluable for snipping away fat from meat, cutting up dried fruit for sauces and toppings, or quickly clipping fresh herbs.

Armed with your new knowledge and a few essential techniques and tools, you'll be able to tackle any recipe, and make it your way — the healthy, delicious way.



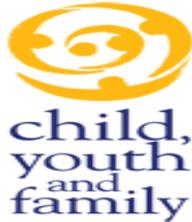


