The Worship of God

The Prologue

Today, we read Luke's version of the Sermon on the Mount, except in this version it is called a sermon on the plain. Supposedly, it was preached on a level place. Well, which is it? Scholars believe these sermons, reflecting the wisdom literature of the ancient world, were not original with Jesus. In fact, he probably never said them! Luke's account of these sage words are much more stark than the dressed-up embellishment offered by Matthew's kinder and gentler, more fully developed narrative. Luke gets right to the point in his interpretation! Rather than "Blessed are the poor in spirit," Luke prefers "Blessed are the poor!" There is no nuance in this writer's musings, no confusion, no mixed signals. Luke then follows suit, using this literal approach for the rest of his litany of blessings. With either interpretation, we are gifted with a beatitude attitude indicating the way we should live. As we consider one of our missionary partners today, these words, as is often the case with the Lectionary, are indeed timely!
