The Prologue

In today's Witness from the Gospels in John, we read a tale of two followers. The heroine in the story is Jesus' closest disciple, Mary, who took a pound of costly perfume and anointed her Rabbi's feet in front of God and everybody. It was a salaciously titillating moment! Judas, the usual fall-guy, the villain in our on-going passion play, observes from a safe distance, becoming increasingly incensed, appalled at this wasteful display, not to mention the suggestive interaction taking place between a man and a woman! Perhaps like Peter in a non-canonical text, Judas was jealous of Mary's close relationship to Jesus, a union that scholars have described in a variety of intimate ways. As always, life and its living, and the way we read these ancient narratives, is always about context! It is context, context, context, every time, all the time! Once again, Mary chose the better thing! Her actions were wastefully divine! Perhaps one of the lessons implied in this text is that, despite being frequently blamed for any number of insignificant and irrelevant indiscretions, a direct result of that whole "original sin" nonsense, women usually make the right decisions, amazingly intuitive in a uniquely feminine way! Some men fail to get the memo and have not learned that not so big secret. These tone deaf sorts desperately need to get with the program in a hurry!
