The Worship of God

The Prologue

The Gospels give us quite a smorgasbord of resurrection appearance options, covering the whole gamut, a huge range of manifestations crossing the spectrum of credulity. The earliest gospel written, Mark, in about 65 CE, provides a skeletal, even minimalist description of the tomb, describing frightened disciples fleeing the scene in fear and amazement, faith nowhere to be found. Matthew and Luke, written about a decade later, put more meat on the bone, enhancing the story, offering greater detail as Jesus appears to His disciples, their faith emboldened as they are equipped, enabled, and empowered for continuing Jesus' mission and ministry, carrying out his legacy by fulfilling the Great Commission. Finally, the last of the Gospels, John, written in about 100 CE, by far contains the largest continuous narrative carefully describing in minute detail the resurrection and subsequent appearances of Jesus. It is by far the most embellished, exaggerated narrative of the four Gospels. Only one thing is sure, one thing for certain, as John Shelby Spong says, "Something happened!" And it is that great, amazing, monumental event in which we place our hope and trust, and all the belief and faith we can humanly muster, enabling, equipping, and empowering us to live resurrected lives. Christ is risen, and so are we! Thanks be to God! Today is all about "resurrecting Jesus!" Our yearning is to live resurrected lives!

Let us pray to the Lord,

Resurrecting God, the message of Easter has come again, and once again, we are surprised by it, far from ready to receive it. The Palm Sunday parade demanded very little of us. We could join in the Hosannas, but the betrayal and denial, the suffering and shame, the agony and death, have left us fearful and shaken, stuck somewhere between Hosannas and Alleluias. We have become enemies of Jesus without intending to be disloyal. We would just as well leave Jesus in the tomb, lest he upset our daily lives. The Jesus of long ago seems more comfortable to us than the Christ who is risen today in our midst, challenging all the preconceptions that guide our daily lives. We confess our reluctance to let Christ claim us and change us. God of resurrection power, we desperately need the forgiveness that only comes from you.

The Assurance of Pardon³

Beloved faith community, hear the good news of Easter! The God of empty tombs and empty hearts, but never empty promises, fills us today with the joy of trusting and believing, that we might rise

from the graves of our misplaced loyalties to live with Christ and serve wherever good news is needed. May gladness flow through us to bring inspiration and hope to sisters and brothers who are locked in their own prisons of despair, that all of us might be risen to live resurrected lives, having the courage to love as you have loved us in Christ Jesus.

The Witness from the Christian Scriptures

Then Peter began to speak to them, "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every people anyone who fears God and practices righteousness is acceptable to God!
