

#### The Prologue

In our Gospel lection this morning, Jesus says, "I came that they may have life and have it abundantly!" What an astonishing statement! One of my favorite authors, Wendell Berry, writes, "To talk about or to desire more abundance of anything has probably always been dangerous, but it seems particularly dangerous now. In an age of materialist science, economics, art and politics, we ought not to be much shocked by the appearance of materialist religion. We know we don't have to look far to find people who equate more abundant life with a bigger car, a bigger house, a bigger bank account and a bigger church." Berry goes on to say that abundance in this verse cannot mean an abundance of stuff, because life does not require an abundance of stuff! It requires only enough! And if we have enough, then life itself, membership in the living world, is already an abundance.

#### The Call to Confession<sup>1</sup>

The scriptures compare us to sheep who have gone astray. As sheep are unable to see beyond the next tuft of grass, we likewise seem to be attracted to the immediate temptation. We often become ravenous consumers rather than good stewards of God's abundance. Christ calls us to respond to the shepherd's voice! In the silence and stillness of these moments, let us confess before the Holy.

#### The Witness from the Christian Scriptures

ACTS 2:42-47

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. Awe came upon everyone because many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. All who believed were together and had all things in common. They would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. The Response: PSALM 23, No. 80 My Shepherd, You Supply My Need RESIGNATION The Witness from the Gospels JOHN 10:1-10

"Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit! The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep! The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers." Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them. So again, Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep! All who came before me are thieves and bandits, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate! Whoever enters by me will be saved and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy! I came that they may have life and have it abundantly!"
