The Prologue

Though usually reserved for funerals and memorial services, providing much needed comfort and succor to those who are grieving, the first fourteen verses of John's Gospel offer a theological smorgasbord to the reader, giving insight into the special relationship between Jesus and his God, the One he intimately knew and related to as Abba, as Father, as holy parent. But there is one verse politely tucked away in the narrative that has oft been quoted as a proof text, arguing for and justifying Christian exclusivity. Jesus is quoted as saying, "I am the way, the truth, and the life! No one comes to the Father except through me!" This short verse has served to defend a Christian bias and exclusiveness, a religious elitism including narrow formulas for prayer and salvation, making Christian responses the only acceptable engagement of the Holy. Today, we go deeper into these mysteries, exploring more fully this narrative, searching for possibilities allowing for a broader and more expansive interpretation, hopefully opening further avenues, creating the potential of revealing God's "extravagant welcome."
