#### The flowers adorning the Chancel for worship today are given by Leta Cole in honor of her mother Linda Cole's birthday.

The color for A Celebration of All Saints is White, symbolizing purity, celebration, and joy, and recalling that the death of the saints represents their "birthday" into eternal life with God.

Ordinary Time refers to that part of the Church Year that does not fall within one of the major seasons and does not observe any specific aspect of the Mystery of Christ. It consists of thirty-four Sundays in the liturgical year and emphasizes personal faith development and nurture, and the growth and enhancement of the Church and the churches. Ordinary Time begins with Baptism of the Lord and encompasses the Sundays after Epiphany including Transfiguration and the Sundays after Pentecost including Reign of Christ. An interesting bit of liturgical trivia is that Baptism of the Lord is counted but is not named as the first Sunday in Ordinary Time.
