The Prologue

The first Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of the Church Year, the first Sunday on the liturgical calendar. Today begins Year B which is led by the Gospel of Mark including a whole lot of John interspersed to fill out the Sunday lections. Advent means "something is coming! Something is on the way!" Traditionally, Advent contains an interesting trinitarian formula that frames its definition. Christians anticipate with great expectation the coming of the Christ Child in the person of Jesus at his birth; the coming of Christ's Spirit into our individual lives, and corporately into the human drama and our wider world in myriad mystical ways; and, the hope for Christ's second coming in what is called in theological parlance, the "parousia," complete with a host of various stark apocalyptic images. This third interpretation is widely debated and doubted by most reputable Biblical scholars. In other words, Jesus is not coming back in the way that the early Church sincerely believed that he would. They thought his return to be imminent, but his permanent delay proved their theory wrong. We are all still here more than 2000 years later! As we enter this holy and blessed season, may the Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love of God come near to us, an Advent of the highest divine order imaginable!
