The Prologue

In the Witness from the Gospels for today Jesus shows off his teaching skills as a rabbi. Already, it is clear at this point in his preaching and teaching, his mission and ministry, that he has built quite a reputation with his rabbinical prowess. Twice in this short reading from the Markan narrative the writer affirms that Jesus taught as one with authority. In this story even the demons hear, acknowledge, and obey! It was not only a compliment describing Jesus' capabilities, but was a slight, perhaps even an insult, to all the religious leaders who masqueraded as authoritative, flaunting their piety for everyone to see, transparently coming off as a total charade, perhaps looking like the charlatans that many of them apparently were. Jesus' message was authentic, genuine in every way, totally real, and was as fresh as a spring rain, and yet as traditional as the faith heritage of his birth, as old, as timeless, as the ancient words he chose to spin.

The flowers adorning the Chancel for worship today are given by Barb Flaherty.

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
