## The Prologue

Last Sunday, as we observed the Day of Pentecost, we celebrated the coming of the Holy Spirit in the wake of the Ascension of Christ. Today we begin the long succession of Sundays "after Pentecost" on the liturgical calendar, Ordinary Time making up the largest part of the Church Year, with a Sunday all its own that honors a doctrine, or teaching of the Church, about the nature of God, called the Trinity. In our own denominational history, this teaching was so problematic to some that it caused a split between Trinitarians and Unitarians, a severing of relationships, ironic since the Trinity reminds us that God is relationship.

### The Call to Confession<sup>1</sup>

In the midst of a time of grieving, the prophet Isaiah went to the temple to pray. In the temple he saw a vision of the majesty of God unfolding before him, moving him to recognize his own unworthiness with a profound sense that he was unclean in the sight of God. Sometimes we think we have nothing to confess, until we are confronted by the awesome presence of the creator of all things. In the presence of God, we come to seek forgiveness and reconciliation. In the awe and wonder, wrapped in the mystery of a transcendent trinity, and in the sacred silence and stillness of our moments together, let us confess before the Holy.

The Witness from the Hebrew Bible

**ISAIAH 6:1-8** 

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty, and the hem of God's robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above God! Each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts! ### The Witness from the Gospels

JOHN 3:1-17

Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with that person." Jesus answered him, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the realm of God without being born from above!" Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the realm of God without being born of water and Spirit! What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit! Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above!' The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So, it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit!" Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" Jesus answered him, "Are you the teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen, yet you do not receive our testimony! If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. For God so loved the world that God gave the only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life! Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world but in order that the world might be saved through him!"

# The flowers adorning the Chancel for worship today are given by Mark and Tobi Johannsen in memory of their parents and siblings they have lost over the years.

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
