In the Witness from the Gospels in Mark, Jesus seeks to find a place of respite and retreat for himself and his weary disciples, giving themselves some much needed rest and relaxation. Due to the needs of the throngs who sought Jesus' care, the rabbi and his disciples were unable to stop and get their desperately desired away time. That is often the case with us! Yet sabbath is so essential to our wellbeing as human beings. We pray for our world and for ourselves. Perhaps part of our finding at least some semblance of sabbath is in finding ways to be civil in our relationships, to find peace and oneness as diverse peoples whenever that goal is possible. As we read the Pauline epistles, we find that building harmony and unity was an essential part of the evangelistic mission of Paul as he carried out his ministry of starting and strengthening churches. The apostle sought diligently to mix and merge Gentiles and Jews, making them into cohesive congregations.

Nancy Diepenbrock EPHESIANS 2:11-22

So then, remember that at one time you were Gentiles by birth, called "the uncircumcision" by those who are called "the circumcision"—a circumcision made in the flesh by human hands— remember that you were at that time without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace! In his flesh he has made both into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us, abolishing the law with its commandments and ordinances, that he might create in himself one new humanity in place of the two, thus making peace, and might reconcile both to God in one body through the cross, thus putting to death that hostility through it. So, he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near, for through him both of us have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then, you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord, in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God.

The color for the Season after Pentecost is Green, symbolizing the growth and development of the Church. Various symbols of the Trinity, such as the Trefoil and Triangle designs used in our sanctuary, remind us of the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and the Triune nature of God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; Parent, Child, Advocate and Comforter; Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer.
