

The Prologue

The feeding of the multitude, also known as the feeding of the five thousand, is found in all four of the Gospel narratives. This fact alone reveals its primacy in the ongoing story of Jesus, a metaphorical tale emphasizing the priority of the table, a reminder of the Great Banquet Feast reflecting the eternal feast in the realm of God. Whether a factual or historical event, or what might be described as "Christian Midrash", a metaphorical story pregnant with symbolic meaning, this text is a reminder that we are called to share our provisions with those who are in need. The child in the story shares from a meager lunch that we assume a mother had lovingly prepared, and everyone follows suit, joining in the party, the impromptu celebration representing God's "extravagant welcome" and bounteous goodness, calling us to live the abundant generosity flowing from the blessings we perceive are our gracious gifts from God. When we reciprocate, that is truly a miracle!

The Witness from the Gospels

JOHN 6:1-21

After this Jesus went to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, also called the Sea of Tiberias. A large crowd kept following him because they saw the signs that he was doing for the sick. Jesus went up the mountain and sat down there with his disciples. Now the Passover, the festival of the Jews, was near. When he looked up and saw a large crowd coming toward him, Jesus said to Philip, "Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?" He said this to test him, for he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him, "Two hundred denarii would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little!" One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?" Jesus said, "Make the people sit down!" Now there was a great deal of grass in the place, so they sat down, about five thousand in all. Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated. So, also the fish, as much as they wanted! When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, "Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost!" So, they gathered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets! When the people saw the sign that he had done, they began to say, "This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world!" When Jesus realized that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain by himself. When evening came, his disciples went down to the sea, got into a boat, and started across the sea to Capernaum. It was now dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. The sea became rough because a strong wind was blowing. When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the sea and coming near the boat, and they were terrified! But he said to them, "It is I! Do not be afraid!" Then they wanted to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat reached the land toward which they were going.

> The color for the Season after Pentecost is Green, symbolizing the growth and development of the Church. Various symbols of the Trinity, such as the Trefoil and Triangle designs used in our sanctuary, remind us of the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and the Triune nature of God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; Parent, Child, Advocate and Comforter; Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer.

Ordinary Time refers to that part of the Church Year that does not fall within one of the major seasons and does not observe any specific aspect of the Mystery of Christ. It consists of thirty-four Sundays in the liturgical year counted backwards from the Reign of Christ and emphasizes personal faith development and nurture, and the growth and enhancement of the Church and the churches.


