## The Prologue

By September 21, 1924, the finishing touches had been made to this amazing edifice where we now worship in real time, this hallowed, sacred space, this Sanctuary in which we are now privileged to offer our praise and adoration to the Holy. What a joyous day it must have been, the cornerstone having been dutifully placed as a witness to one and all that this building would rest on this spot, safe and secure at the corner of First and Division Streets, a building soaring to the skies in perpetuity. Interestingly, eighty-four years later another celebratory service of thanksgiving and dedication would be held on the same date, September 21, 2008, to honor the renovation of this beautiful Sanctuary.

Once upon a time the Gospel of Mark tells us that a conversation presumably took place between Jesus and the disciples with the rabbi asking these closest followers about his identity, a question regarding who they thought he was. In another version of the Gospel, after Peter provides the correct answer about Jesus being the Christ, the Messiah, Jesus declares in Matthew 16:18 that upon this rock he will build the Church. Today, we celebrate this local rock, this rock of ages, a building of mortar and stone made with human hands to the glory of God! One hundred years and counting!

## The Witness from the Gospels

MARK 8:27-38

The color for the Season after Pentecost is Green, symbolizing the growth and development of the Church. Various symbols of the Trinity, such as the Trefoil and Triangle designs used in our sanctuary, remind us of the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and the Triune nature of God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; Parent, Child, Advocate and Comforter; Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer.

Ordinary Time refers to that part of the Church Year that does not fall within one of the major seasons and does not observe any specific aspect of the Mystery of Christ. It consists of thirty-four Sundays in the liturgical year counted backwards from the Reign of Christ and emphasizes personal faith development and nurture, and the growth and enhancement of the Church and the churches.

The cornerstone at the west entryway of this sacred edifice is a reminder of the year signaling the completion of the building that houses this Sanctuary. Records indicate that on September 21, 1924, the first worship service was held in the newly minted facility. The services of dedication celebrating the raising of this sacred space were held from Sunday, February 8th through Thursday, February 12, 1925. The hymns, Treble Choir anthem, and solo selection chosen for our celebration today were taken from the music selections chosen for those services. The "Act of Dedication" is the dedicatory litany invoked during the Sunday, eleven o'clock in the morning worship service held on February 12, 1925.

# The flowers adorning the Chancel for worship today are placed in honor of the dedication of the building that houses the Sanctuary.
