

## The Prologue

In the lectionary texts chosen for worship today, an emphasis focusing on the vulnerability of widows takes center stage in two of the lections. In the Witness from the Hebrew Bible, we find a portion of the beautiful love story comprising the book of Ruth, a novella that comes as close to a romance novel as there is in the Bible. Underlying the drama that unfolds in the creative plotline of the story, the fragile dynamics associated with widows and orphans back in the day is fully revealed, clearly on display. In the Witness from the Gospels in Mark we read the story of what is traditionally called "the widow's mite", a story describing an impoverished woman who puts her last two coins, worth about a penny, into the temple treasury. She gave all the money she had! Once again, there is more to the story than the obvious.

HEBREWS 9:24-28

### The Witness from the Gospels

MARK 12:38-44

As he taught, he said, "Beware of the scribes, who like to walk around in long robes and to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces and to have the best seats in the synagogues and places of honor at banquets! They devour widows' houses and for the sake of appearance say long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation!" He sat down opposite the treasury and watched the crowd putting money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which are worth a penny. Then he called his disciples and said to them, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. For all of them have contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on."

The color for the Season after Pentecost is Green, symbolizing the growth and development of the Church. Various symbols of the Trinity, such as the Trefoil and Triangle designs used in our sanctuary, remind us of the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and the Triune nature of God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; Parent, Child, Advocate and Comforter; Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer.

Ordinary Time refers to that part of the Church Year that does not fall within one of the major seasons and does not observe any specific aspect of the Mystery of Christ. It consists of thirty-four Sundays in the liturgical year counted backwards from the Reign of Christ and emphasizes personal faith development and nurture, and the growth and enhancement of the Church and the churches.
