The Witness from the Gospels

MATTHEW 2:1-12

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, magi from the east came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star in the east and have come to pay him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him, and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it has been written by the prophet: 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah, for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel." Worship Notes:

Today's scripture lessons are from the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible, Updated Edition.

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The Epiphany of Our Lord, AKA The Manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles, is a non-movable feast day always observed on January 6. This high and holy festival day celebrates the visitation of the Wise Men to the young Jesus. AKA Theophany or Three Kings' Day, Epiphany is one of the principal and oldest festival days of the Christian Church. Older than Christmas, Epiphany has its origins in paganism, from whence most Christian festivals emerge. Like Christmas, Epiphany is rooted in the ancient rituals associated with the Winter Solstice. Epiphany is Christmas Eve in the Eastern traditions following the Julian calendar! This sacred day reminds Christians everywhere of Christ's "extravagant welcome," expansive inclusion, open invitation, and radical hospitality, the love of God poured out upon the whole world!

What we know about the infamous wise men of old is that we know absolutely nothing, or at the least, next to nothing! This threesome is shrouded in ultimate mystery, magically disappearing from the scene as quickly as they appear, an art imitating life epiphany! The best testament we can afford them is that they were of gentile origin and were some kind of astrologers, soothsayers, mystics of some variety. Perhaps they were sorcerers, magicians? Who knows? Some scholars have suggested they were Zoroastrians, followers of the god named Ahura Mazda. Zoroastrianism is one of the world's oldest religions. No, the child, Jesus, did not try to convert them! This trio, a trifecta of human trinitarian substance, represent a radical new paradigm springing forth from the old order, traditional Judaism ironically given a new, but very old, twist! These mythic figures are literary reminders of the call of God to all persons, that love of God was and is intended to be extended to everyone. The word "epiphany" means "appearance," a manifestation of revelation quality. Epiphany, as a liturgical celebration, a pivotal part of the Church Year, speaks to the light of God revealed! May it still be so today!
